

### **THE CHILDREN ARE LISTENING SO, LET'S MAKE IT PLAIN**

Jesus spoke many times about children. He said our faith must "be as a little child" - unconditional and continuous. The first part of Mark 10 deals with family matters; then we have vv 13-16: And they brought young children to Him that He should touch them; and His disciples rebuked those who brought them. But when Jesus saw it, He was much displeased, and said unto them: "Suffer (allow) the little children to



come unto Me, and forbid them not (quit forbidding them); for of such is the Kingdom of God. Verily, I say unto you, Whosoever shall not receive the Kingdom of God as a little child, he shall not enter therein". And He took them up in His arms, put His hands upon them, and blessed them".

It was after this that the "rich young ruler" came running up to Jesus with his now-famous question; and after that discussion, Jesus began to refer to His disciples as "children".

Our church has been well blessed with precious children; and The Lord has entrusted them into our care to "show and tell" them about Him. ### "TO SUPPORT AND DEFEND THE CONSTITUTION"

James Madison, the father of our Constitution, wrote in the Federalist Paper 45: "The powers delegated by the proposed Constitution to the federal government are few and defined. Those which are to remain in the State governments are numerous and indefinite. The former (powers to the federal government) will be exercised principally on external objects, as war, peace, negotiation, and foreign commerce ... (while) ... the powers reserved to the several States will extend to all the objects which in the ordinary course of affairs, concern the lives and liberties, and properties of the people, and the internal order, improvement and prosperity of the State".
